Students may take as many courses as they desire as a non-degree student; however, ***only up to six credits of advanced course work taken on a non-degree basis at the University of Connecticut may be included on a Master's degree plan of study, provided the following conditions are met:*** (1) the grades earned in such course work are B (not B-) or higher; (2) such course work is within the six-year limit for completion of Master's degree requirements; and (3) such credits have not been applied toward any other degree, here or elsewhere (already completed or to be completed in the future).

Students who are seeking the **Master of Engineering (MENG)** degree must meet the MENG Course requirements. Visit <http://www.engr.uconn.edu/meng/> . Students who are seeking the **Master of Science** degree or the **Ph.D.** degree in Engineering must meet *additional* degree requirements beyond the minimum standards set by the University of Connecticut Graduate School.
